Our PGL visit to 'Little Canada'

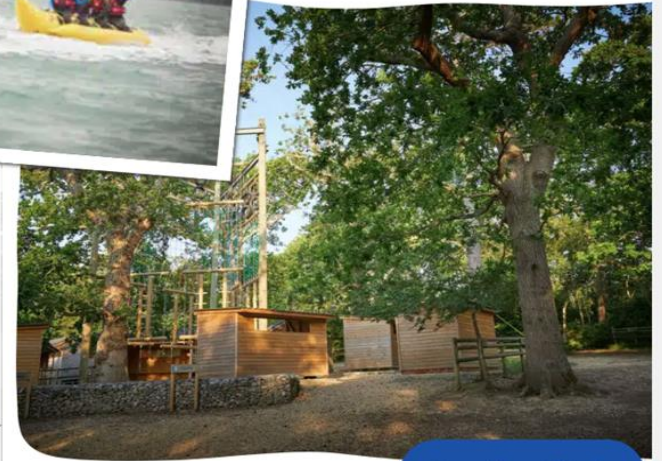
- Allow children to forge new friendships

Where are we going?

A little piece of paradise on the Isle of Wight

Set in 48 acres of woodland on the banks of Wootton Creek with quaint log cabins, it would be easy to confuse Little Canada with the country from which it draws inspiration. Locations don't come much better than this and we also have private access direct to the water from our seafront.

Little Canada is home to our **DISCOVER! Adventure** and **EXPLORE! Adventure** multi-activity camps, and for those looking for something extra-special, our **TRAILBLAZE! Adventure: Aqua Explorer** includes off-site watersports such as banana boats, keelboat sailing and wake boarding.

Please ensure that all the items below are clearly named:

Sleeping:

The children will need a sleeping bag and pillow with a pillow case – a bottom single fitted sheet is provided by PGL.

Tops and Jackets

Waterproof jacket with a hood

2 Sweatshirts / fleece or jumper

At least 3 short sleeved t - Shirts

1 Long sleeved t - shirt - (these need to cover the arms for some activities)

Trousers

3 pairs of shorts

4 pairs of trousers / Jogging bottoms

Hygiene

Do not bring:


- Electronic devices, computer games, snacks, jewellery / valuable, aerosols or a mobile phone
- Any medications other than what has been logged with the school staff
- Sweets - **the bags are checked for these**
- Extra spending money other than what has been advised and checked in with the school staff

Extra Information:

- You will be spending a lot of time outdoors so please bring suitable clothing and footwear.
- Please mark **all** your things with your name.
- Your kit should be kept in a holdall or small suitcase that you can carry/wheel.
- Return Travel/Sea sickness tablets in a sealed, named envelope, and given to the teachers when medicine and spending money is given in on **Friday 28th June at 08:30 am**
- Children can bring up to £12 to spend
- Please make sure they have an afternoon snack for the ferry crossing - we will be having dinner at PGL on the Sunday evening.



Medication and Pocket Money

- Please bring any medications that you have logged on the medical form into the school (Main Hall) on Friday 26th September between 08:30 am and 09:15 am. We will check this in, and log the timings that that medication need to be taken. **Please do not give this to the school office.**
 - Please do not arrive with medications or travel sickness tablets that are not on the medical form
 - Pocket Money (up to £12.00 only) needs to be also brought in (Main Hall) on Friday 26th also. Please ensure that this money is in a named wallet, envelope or purse. Please do not pack the money into your children's luggage.
 - We will keep an overview of their spending throughout the week and they will be advised to spend a bit each day.


Keeping in Touch

- We have set up a google classroom account called 'Little Canada 2025'. Your children already have google accounts, and will be invited to join the classroom.
- We will post photos and news so that you are able to keep up with our adventures (**we have a list of who can and cannot have their photo taken / published**)
- Please don't use this platform to ask specific questions about your children. If there are any issues, we will contact you directly. **Remember, you child should not bring a mobile phone.**





Arrival Home

- As discussed, we arrive home on Wednesday 3rd June at approximately 5:30 pm. We will parentmail you to keep you updated of arrival times and any delays
 - Please ensure that you are here on time to collect your children - they will be dismissed to you
 - No child will be allowed to walk home on their own
 - Please collect medications the following day from the school office unless urgently required
 - Pupils are allowed the next day (Thursday) off from school if needed / wanted.

FAQs




Can I call and speak to my child / can my child call and speak to me whilst they are away?

Unfortunately, this will not happen. Staff will comfort any children who are feeling a little homesick. This does not happen very much as children are so busy all day long.




What happens if my child gets sick / wets the bed / gets hurt?

School staff will be in rooms near the children's cabins. Staff names are pinned on the cabins. Staff are discrete when sorting these issues out.



Will school staff call me?

School staff will only call you if they need to give you information, such as; if your child has been unwell, has been hurt and has needed medical attention by the first aid staff onsite if we need to take your child to the local minor injury clinic, etc (this will not happen for minor scrapes and cuts) . This is why it is crucial that you put more than one up-to-date telephone number that you can be contacted on.
