





### WELCOME BACK!

## MATHS

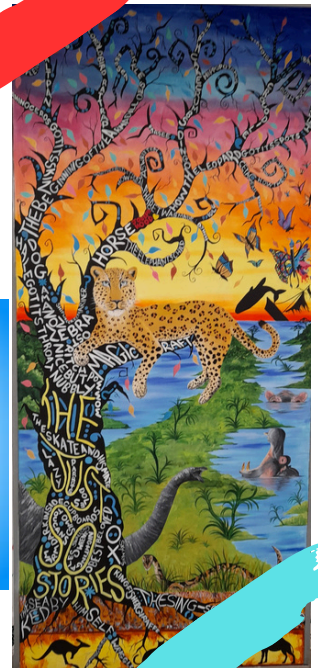
Year 4 will be focusing on several important topics in Maths, including:

## TOPIC

In the Spring term, our topic is 'Around the World in 80 Days.' We will be learning about the world and how it is organised, using maps, globes, and atlases to locate continents, countries, and capital cities. As we follow Phileas Fogg's journey around the world, we will explore how different places vary in their physical and human geography, including landscapes, climate, and ways of life.
